The Arkansas Labor Market is prepared monthly in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). The current month's estimates are preliminary, while previous month's data is

subject to revision.

Estimates of nonfarm payroll jobs show the number of jobs by industry and reflect employment by place of work. Hours and earnings estimates are based on payroll and worker-hour data collected for production workers in manufacturing industries.

Industries are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). All estimates are based on a first quarter 2024 benchmark.

# Explanation of Terms and Concepts

#### Monthly Business

#### **Survey of Employers**

A monthly sample survey designed to provide industry information on nonfarm payroll jobs. Data are compiled each month from mail surveys and telephone interviews conducted by the Bu-reau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with Department of Workforce Services. The data are based on establishment records and include all workers, fullor part-time, who received pay during the payroll period which includes the 12th of the month. Approximately

#### **Metropolitan**

#### **Statistical Areas**

A term applied by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget to counties that have one or more central cities and that meet specified criteria of population density, commuting patterns and social and economic integration.

#### **Current Population**

#### Survey (CPS)

A monthly sample survey of the population 16 years of age and over, designed to provide data on the labor force, the employed and the unemployed. The survey is conducted each month by the Bureau of the Census for BLS. The information is collected by trained interviewers from a sample of about 60,000 households. The data collected are based on the activity reported for the calendar week including the 12th of the month. Approximately 1,200 Arkansas households are represented in the sample survey.

#### **Civilian Labor Force**

The sum of all employed and unemployed persons 16 years of age or older. Members of the Armed Forces are excluded.

#### **Employment**

An estimate of the number of persons who worked any time for pay or profit or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family business during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month. Also included are those who, although not working, had some job attachment and were not looking for work, and persons involved in labor management disputes.

#### <u>Unemployment</u>

An estimate of the number of persons who did not have a job, but were available for work and actively seeking work during the calendar week which includes the 12th of the month.

#### <u>Unemployment</u>

#### <u>Rate</u>

The number of unemployed as a percentage of the civilian labor force. Unemployment rates are calculated from unrounded data.

#### <u>Seasonal</u>

#### <u>Adjustment</u>

A statistical technique applied to monthly data to eliminate changes that normally occur during the year due to seasonal events such as weather, major holidays, schedule shifts, harvest times, and the opening/closing of schools.


# Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS)

The Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS) is a monthly survey developed and conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) to address the need for data on job openings, hires, and separations. These data serve as demand-side indicators of labor shortages at the national and state levels. The availability of unfilled jobs- the job opening rate- is an important measure of the tightness of job markets, parallel to existing measures of unemployment.

Data from a sample of approximately 21,000 US business establishments are collected by BLS monthly. JOLTS collects data on Total Employment, Job Openings, Hires, Quits, Layoffs and Discharges, and Other Separations. While data are available by industry sector at the national level, statewide level data are currently only available as a total figure representing all industry sectors. The most recent data available is for July 2025.

# **Civilian Labor Force Summary**

The Arkansas Department of Commerce, in conjunction with the Bureau of Labor Statistics, announced Arkansas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased one-tenth of a percentage point, from 3.7% in July to 3.8% in August. At 4.3%, the United States' jobless rate also rose one-tenth of a percentage between July and August.

Arkansas' civilian labor force increased by 2,480, a result of 1,683 more employed and 797 additional unemployed Arkansans actively looking for work. The gains were enough to push the unemployment rate up one-tenth of a percentage point in August, while the labor force participation rate remained stable at 58.4%.


Compared to August 2024, the number of employed in the State has grown by 8,665. There are 4,889 more unemployed actively seeking employment, as the unemployment rate is up three-tenths of a percentage point. Arkansas' labor force participation rate is up one-tenth of a percentage point over the year.




#### Monthly Job Gains/Losses by Major Industry Sector











# **County Labor Force Summary**


Between July and August, unemployment rates declined in 60 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Rates were stable in eleven counties, while four counties posted rate increases. Rates ranged from a low of 3.1% in Benton County to a high of 7.2% in Desha County.

In August, no county in Arkansas had an unemployment rate at or below 3%. Two counties reported a jobless rate at or above seven percent, down from three counties above 7% in July.

Compared to August 2024, jobless rates are up in 74 of Arkansas' 75 counties. Only Lincoln County posted a lower rate over the year, down three-tenths of a percentage point. Rate increases ranged from as little as one-tenth of a percentage point in 5 counties to as much as a one and eight-tenths of a percentage point increase in Howard County. The average annual jobless rate increase was six-tenths of a percentage point.
